# SUMMARY OF CURRENT EM PROJECTS

---

- Review and Revision of WMFN's Emergency Plan, including:
  - Set up of Emergency Operations Centre in the Health Centre Conference Room;
  - Training of EOC Team Members;
  - Funding and delivery goods and training of:
    - 2020 Emergency Operations Centres & Training \$25,000 funded by UBCM:
      - WIFI, Laptops and printer, charts, and all associated Emergency Management BC paperwork
    - 2020 Emergency Support Services (ESS) & Training \$22.141 funded by UBCM:
      - ESS Kits w/ equipment, materials, handbooks, First Aid Kit, PPE, etc.; and
      - Reception Centre Kits.

# SUMMARY OF CURRENT EM PROJECTS CONT'D

---

- WMFN COVID-19 Response Plan:
  - Developed WMFN COVID-19 Response Plan and had it approved by Chief & Council - implemented
  - Community Isolation & Controlled Access March 23<sup>rd</sup> – June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020;
  - Ongoing interruptions to WMFN's Business Continuity as required in response to confirmed cases of COVID-19 within WMFN Community
- WMFN COVID-19 Re-Opening Plan:
  - Developed WMFN COVID-19 Re-Opening Plan and supporting documents (Policies incl/ Protocols) and had it approved by Chief & Council - implemented
  - Meeting all Federal and Provincial requirements as directed by (but not limited to):
    - BC's Public Health Officer (PHO);
    - BC's Northern Health Authority;
    - First Nations Health Authority (FNHA); and
    - WorkSafe BC.

# PLANNED EM PROJECTS FOR 2021-22

- Hazard, Risk and Vulnerability Assessment (HRVA):

- 
- A comprehensive plan that takes into account all potential hazards and associated risks that WMFN may face, determine the Nations' vulnerability and determine the appropriate strategies and plans to mitigate said hazards and risks to the Nations, its Community, and its people;
    - This will mitigate the Nations' vulnerabilities and improve the Nations' Resiliency!
  - Apply for funding; and
  - Put together a HRVA Project Team of up to 16 people to complete the HRVA, including consultation with WMFN members.

- Community Wildfire Resiliency Plan (CWRP):

- A much-needed prerequisite program that will provide WMFN the ability to plan to reduce wildfire risks and impacts to the Community for periods of 3 to 5 years at a time
- Applied for 2021 UBCM EOC&T and ESS Funding for acquiring more Emergency Management goods, materials, and training.
